3. Vince's parents tell him he has to have a vegetable with his dinner and his choices are broccoli, which he likes, and corn that he does not like at all.
4. An 18 -year-old has been offered a job that pays a lot of money which she loves, but that has terrible hours which she hates. He must decide whether or not to take the position. She is conflicted about if she should take the job.
5. You have just found your dream apartment - it has a great location and all the extras you want. Unfortunately, it cost more than you want to spend. You are conflicted - should you sign the lease for the apartment or not?
6. Cole plays both baseball and basketball and loves both sports. His last basketball game of the season is on the same day and time of his opening day game of his baseball season, and he can only play in one game.
7. Marcy has been accepted to both her dream college the University of Illinois AND her safety school, which is Yale. Marcy needs to pick which school she will attend.
8. Your roommate is very difficult for you to live with because she stays up all night listening to loud music. You like the apartment that you live in currently, but hate your roommate. If you move out, you will lose your deposit which will be a hardship. You could rent an apartment by yourself, which would be quieter and make you happier. However if you live alone, it will be in a shabby place because that is all you can afford. You are conflicted about if you should stay with your current roommate or move into a place on your own.
9. There are two classes that Mary wants to take; they are both offered at 11:00 am on Mondays and Wednesdays and because they are both at the same time she can only pick one.

Mary does not want to take Mr. Hughes for English, but there are no other times slots open this semester, and if she does not take his class now, she will have to postpone graduation, which is not good.
